




Initial Unemployment Claims

Unemployment Claims / Labor Force



Normalized Continued Claims Trends





New Haven's unemployment claims peaked in July, while claims across the State and Country peaked in early May. Our number of claims have declined 33.7% since peaking (as opposed to 44.2% in CT and 78.8% in the USA) at an average rate of 1.1% per week, trailing the rate of decrease across the Nation at large. Unemployment claims have leveled off at a national scale, and have been rising in Connecticut and New Haven, since December.



- The recovery in labor force participation has been uneven, with rates remaining the lowest among women of all races.




Civilian labor force participation rate, seasonally adjusted Click and drag within the chart to zoom in on time periods

Impacts on Consumer Confidence

An indicator above 100 signals a boost in the consumers' confidence towards the future economic situation, because of which they are less prone to save, and more inclined to spend money on major purchases in the next 12 months. Values below 100 indicate a pessimistic attitude towards future developments in the economy, possibly resulting in a tendency to save more and consume less.



TTP Parking Revenue by Week













Economic Health Indicator

PPP Assistance Round One



- New Haven leads the state with 735 housing permits so far in 2020, which is more than the next 4 towns' combined totals for this year
- New Haven has had 1012 housing permits issued since 2019, the only other towns with over 300 during that time are Stamford (431) and Shelton (329)


Housing Permit Activity

In the past three years (2018-2020) New Haven has granted 1,405 Housing permits. In the seven years prior to 2018 (2011-2018) New Haven granted 1,290 permits.


